ANNUAL PROGRAM EVENTS

AN OVERVIEW

The Virginia Tech Composition Program routinely sponsors the following activities to build and sustain a culture of connection, support, and community.



ONE-WEEK AUGUST WORKSHOP

Each August, the program leadership team organizes and leads a one-week workshop designed to welcome and prepare GTAs who will be teaching in the Composition Program for the first time. (open and optional for all instructional staff)



COMMUNITY DAY

Thursday of the August Workshop is featured as Community Day, a one-day gathering of all instructional staff organized around a featured presenter and workshop leader from another university and including an early evening social event.



COMPOSITION COLLOQUIUM SERIES

At least once per semester, the program hosts a featured speaker and/or teaching workshop leader whose visit is intentionally aligned with program principles, curricular emphases, or the expressed interests of GTAs and instructors teaching in the program.



TEACHING TALKS, TEACHING CIRCLES

The program initiates three professional development gatherings each semester, which are framed as teaching talks or teaching circles. Formats and focuses for these one-hour sessions vary widely and are designed to support all who are teaching in the program.

Many are open to the department, campus, and public.
